What is Title I?

Mt. Zion Elementary School is identified as a Title I school as part of the Every Student Succeeds Act of 2015 (ESSA). Title I is designed to support State and local school reform efforts tied to challenging state academic standards, to reinforce and enhance efforts to improve teaching and learning for students. Title I programs must be based on effective means of improving student achievement and include strategies to support Parent and Family Engagement Mt. Zion Elementary hosted meetings on two different dates at 4 different times, August 16, 2018 at 10:00am/1:00pm and 1:00 pm, and August 21 at 10:00am/ 1:00 pm to ensure that the Parent and Family Engagement Plan was jointly developed with all parents. At each meeting parents had a chance to provide input for the 2018-2019 Parent and Family Engagement Plan. A hard copy of the Parent and Family Engagement Plan Input form was sent home to all parents in students' blue folders on October 11, 2018, and placed on the school website at http://clayton.016.schooldesk.net to ensure that the Plan was jointly developed by all stakeholders.

Mt. Zion Elementary's Plan for Shared Student Achievement

What is it?

This is a plan that describes how Mt. Zion Elementary will provide opportunities to improve parent family engagement to support student learning. Mt. Zion Elementary values the contributions and involvement of parents to establish an equal partnership for the common goal of improving student achievement by offering a variety of decision-making opportunities for parents to participate in which include School Council, Parent Advisory Council, Parent Focus Groups, roundtable discussions, and PTO. Parents are also invited to participate in Parent Academy Workshops, Donuts with Dads, Career Day, Curriculum Night, GMAS Forums, and Principal Talk Back Forums to promote student learning at school and at home.



How is it revised?

Mt. Zion Elementary invited all parents to meetings in April, May and August 2018, to participate and provide suggestions and ideas to improve the Parent and Family Engagement Plan for the 2018-2019 school year. A flyer advertising the meetings was sent home in weekly communication folders with all students, and the meetings were advertised on the school marque. The Parent and Family Engagement Plan input form was also posted on the school website at http://clayton.016.schooldesk.net for parents to print and provide input. At least three meetings were held during the mornings and evenings in order to give all parents of students an opportunity to attend a meeting to provide input and to participate in the joint development of the Plan. During these meetings, parents reviewed, discussed, and gave input on the Plan. We also conducted an online Parent Involvement survey during the Spring at http://clayton.co1.qualtrics.com/jfe/form/SV-5d5dA66VcTUrsvH, and a paper copy was sent home with each student to give parents the opportunity to provide their input. Additionally, parents were given an opportunity to provide input for the Plan during the Annual Title I meeting in August 2018. Parent input from these meetings was used to revise the 2018-2019 Parent and Family Engagement Plan. All feedback received was considered during the Plan revision for this school year.

Who is it for?

All students participating in the Title I, Part A program, and their families, are encouraged and invited to fully participate in the opportunities described in this plan. Mt. Zion Elementary will provide full opportunity for the participation of parents with non-English speaking parents, as well as parents with disabilities and parents of migratory children.

Where is it available?

The revised plan was included in the Title I documents sent home the first week of school, posted on the school's website, http://clayton.016.schooldesk.net, and paper copies are available in the Parent Resource Center, Room 105, as well as on the counter in front office.

On the 2016 CCCRPI report, we will increase the CCRPI performance indicator in mathematics by 3% in grades 3-5. The focus for math is:

- Multiplication and Division in 100
- Addition and subtraction of fractions with like denominator
- Developing fractions and equivalent fractions especially fractions with numerator 1

School-Parent Compacts

Mt. Zion Elementary hosted three meetings fall of 2018 to give all parents the opportunity to provide input for the compact.
