### In our Classrooms

The 3<sup>rd</sup>-5<sup>th</sup> grade team will work with students and their families to support students' success in math. Some of our key connections with families will be to provide:

- families with practice constructed-response math questions for use at home.
- families will read short passages to encourage student reading comprehension
- families with monthly newsletters.
- families with resources targeting all content areas
- families with Parent Academic Workshops focusing on Math Skills and reading.
- afterschool assistance.
